Luke 6:47-49 "Everyone who comes to me and hears my words and does them, I will show you what he is like: he is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. - Q1. Who Made You?
A. God
- Q2. What else did God make?
A. God made all things
- Q3. Why did God make you and all things?
A. For his own glory.
- Q4. How can you glorify God?
A. By loving him and doing what he commands.
- Q16. Who were our first parents?
A. Adam and Eve
- Q17. How did God create man?
A. God created man, male and female, after his own image.
- Q18. Of what were our first parents made?
A. God made Adam's body out of the ground and Eve's body out of a rib from Adam.
- Q23. What covenant did God make with Adam?
A. The covenant of life
- Q25. In the covenant of life, what did God require Adam to do?
A. To obey God perfectly.
- Q28. Did Adam keep the covenant of life?
A. No. He sinned against God.

Jr. High-College – Westminster Shorter Catechism

- Q. 85. *What doth God require of us that we may escape his wrath and curse due to us for sin?*
A. To escape the wrath and curse of God due to us for sin, God requireth of us faith in Jesus Christ, repentance unto life, with the diligent use of all the outward means whereby Christ communicateth to us the benefits of redemption.
- Q. 86. *What is faith in Jesus Christ?*
A. Faith in Jesus Christ is a saving grace, whereby we receive and rest upon him alone for salvation, as he is offered to us in the gospel.
- Q. 88. *What are the outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicateth to us the benefits of redemption?*
A. The outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicateth to us the benefits of redemption, are his ordinances, especially the word, sacraments, and prayer; all which are made effectual to the elect for salvation.
- Q. 89. *How is the word made effectual to salvation?*
A. The Spirit of God maketh the reading, but especially the preaching, of the word, an effectual means of convincing and converting sinners, and of building them up in holiness and comfort, through faith, unto salvation.
- Q. 90. *How is the word to be read and heard, that it may become effectual to salvation?*
A. That the word may become effectual to salvation, we must attend thereunto with diligence, preparation and prayer; receive it with faith and love, lay it up in our hearts, and practice it in our lives.
- Q. 98. *What is prayer?*
A. Prayer is an offering up of our desires unto God, for things agreeable to his will, in the name of Christ, with confession of our sins, and thankful acknowledgment of his mercies.
